The association's annual conference, sponsored by Nikon, will be held at the Jewish Museum, on 4th November. Delegates should allow plenty of time for accessing the museum, as for obvious reasons the museum operates extensive security procedures. The provisional programme is as follows:

- 10.10 Presentation on the development project at the new Jewish Museum by the architect MJ Long, from Long and Kentish Architects.
- 10.40 Ruth Press will talk about her father Boris Bennett, an East End Wedding Photographer whose archive (and camera) is held at the Jewish Museum.
- 11.20 James Davies, the Tate Gallery's Online Collection Editor will talk about the Tate's online video content.
- 12.00 Nicola Solomon, a consultant at Finers Stephens Innocent LLP and an expert in law relating to visual arts will give a brief outline of current UK law as it relates to museum and fine art photographers, covering what they can photograph, copyright in objects photographed and how to protect copyright in their own photographs, particularly considering the impact of the internet.

- 14.15 Don McCullin's life and work has been shaped by war. His work, in turn, has shaped our understanding of war. This presentation by Hilary Roberts, Head of Imperial War Museum Photograph Archive, will look at Don McCullin's contribution to war photography as he marks his 75th birthday. The Imperial War Museum exhibition is currently on display at the Victoria Art Gallery in Bath after a successful 6 months display at IWM North, Manchester.

DAY TWO

East London Undone

Olympic Site Free Bus Tour

This will be a bus tour around the Olympic site with a photographer from the Olympic Delivery Authority accompanying us and talking about the photography of the site, which has included aerial photography. The tour starts at 3.30pm and will last approximately one hour, there are only **30** seats available. All visitors require photographic identification in the form of a **driver's licence or passport, and this identification must be brought on the day otherwise access will be denied. There are no exceptions to this rule.**

NB. The Olympics Delivery Authority has the following requirements and restrictions, these are as follows:

- No photography will be allowed on site at any time
- Names of attendees must be submitted at least seven days prior to the visit
- Cancellations must be made five days in advance, wherever possible
- The ODA will endeavour to provide five days notice if a cancellation has to be made
- All visits will start and finish at Stratford Regional Station
- Please be aware that there are no toilet facilities on the bus
